Writing Tasks -

$27 - 15 =$ $33 - 25 =$ $783 - 659 =$ $69,548 - 45,999 =$

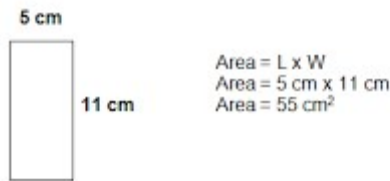

Some girls in Sara's class are saying nasty things and telling lies about her. They tell her that they're not going to let her join in their games at playtime.

Kai gets home and finds there is no-one home. He doesn't have a key and doesn't know when anybody will be back. It will be dark soon.

Mina is at her friend Laura's house. Laura tells Mina to try a drink from the fridge even though Mina knows the drink belongs to Laura's mum and dad and they shouldn't touch it.
