Synonyms are words with similar meanings which we can use to extend our vocabulary and make our writing more interesting. Your tasks will help you understand what a synonym is, identify and give your own examples of some synonyms.</p> <p>Example - We often overuse simple words like nice which can make a sentence boring: We had a nice meal. By using a synonym, it becomes more interesting: We had a delicious meal.</p> <p>Activity - See powerpoints.
